Bible Study – December 9, 2020 The Book of Ephesians – Chapter 3

This chapter closes the first half of Ephesians in which Paul has described our wealth in Christ. Paul is about to move into our walk with Christ.

I. Paul's Explanation of His Ministry (3:1–12)

The first thing we note is that Paul calls himself a prisoner and that he connects his imprisonment to the Gentiles! Go back to Acts 22 for the explanation. Paul had been arrested in Jerusalem and was making his defense to his people.

Paul explains that God had given him a special revelation and a special stewardship (dispensation).
