We will invite the Holy Spirit to ask us **three vital questions today**, prompted by those Christ prioritized with His disciples in Matthew 16:13-19. For our immediate purposes we will apply them to God the Father, keeping in mind Christ's own words: that the Father and He are one (John 10:30).

Question 1: Who do People say God is?

- a. Public opinion spans the spectrum from God is Nonexistent to God is the God of the Bible. <u>1 Peter 2:2 Like</u> newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation— We have to grow in the knowledge of God.
- b. Perhaps the most __dangerously influential opinions are those held by scholars and intellectuals who teach a kind of "__goal_" but not the God of the Bible.
- c. All attempts to <u>Define</u> <u>God</u> cannot help but <u>minimize</u> <u>him</u>. If in our pursuit of greater knowledge God seems to have gotten <u>smaller</u>, we have been <u>deceived</u>.

Question 2: Who do You say God is? JESUS WANTS TO KNOW WHO DO YOU SAY IAM

- a. Great wisdom resides in taking an <u>inventory</u> of how we have <u>developed</u> our present perceptions of God. Keep in mind that faith that remains <u>unchallenged</u> ordinarily remains <u>unchanged</u>.
- b. Sometimes we may realize that we have created a **God** in **man's** own image who is not God at all.
- c. Matthew 16:18-20 could very well intimate that God entrusts greater Supernatural Empowerment to those who believe He is who He say is.

Matthew: 16: 17 And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. WE WANT GOD TO REVEAL HIMSELF TO US.... THROUGH HIS WORD AND WORKS AND THROUGH THE REVELATION HE GIVES US..... WHEN WE BELIEVE WE RECEIVE A SPIRITUAL EMPOWERMENT.

18 And I tell you, you are Peter, PETER IN THE GREEK – PETROS – PIECE OR FRAGREMENT OF A BIGGER ROCK.... and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. Jesus is the architect of the church it's not ours it's his....

¹⁹I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

Did you know we had we have keys....there are four keys....

1. <u>His word is a Key</u>.... We have heard a man word is his bond... then it stand to reason God's word is His bond... His word is our passport to the other side... If you don't believe.... Let your partner walk away from you and you feeling rejected: see wont Psalm 46 comfort you.... God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.... Get in trouble.... Flip back to Psalm 23 the Lord is my Shephard I shall not want....

- 2. Pray is the 2nd key pray is to the soul is what air is to our lungs.... 2 Chronicles 7:14.... If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land. We know him through communing with him in prayer....
- 3. <u>Stewardship is the key...</u> Malachi 3:10 <u>Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, That there may be food in My house, And try Me now in this," Says the LORD of hosts, "If I will not open for you the windows of heaven And pour out for you such blessing That there will not be room enough to receive it.</u>
- 4. <u>The preacher:</u> Romans 10:14-15_¹⁴ But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed?^[a] And how are they to believel^[b] in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him? ¹⁵ And how are they to proclaim him unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

Question 3: Who does God say that He is?

God reveals Himself two primary ways:

a. His WORD. See Psalm 100:1-3.

Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth. ² Serve the LORD with gladness; come into his presence with singing. ³ Know that the LORD is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people and the sheep of his pasture.

Lord – yahew -eloheh

He is a God who requires adoration, He's a God that requires praises... He is the God our creator... He is the God our provider

b. His <u>WORKS</u>. See Psalm 145:1-6.

I will extol you, my God and King, and bless your name forever and ever. ² Every day I will bless you

and praise your name forever and ever. ³ Great is the LORD and greatly to be praised; his **Greatness is unsearchable**. ⁴ One generation shall extol your works to another and shall declare your mighty acts. ⁵ They will recount the glorious[®] splendor of your majesty, and on your wondrous works I will meditate. ⁶ They will proclaim the might of your awesome deeds, and I will declare your greatness.

Close with a poem from Beth Moore....

He is Elohim, Creator, the Omnipotent who rules. He's the Sovereign King of glory, and earth is His footstool. He is the Alpha and Omega, the Beginning and the End.

He sends forth lightning that later checks back in with Him.

He speaks worlds into <u>existence</u> and spins them out in space. He gives orders to the morning and shows the dawn its place. He prophesies the future; then orders it fulfilled. He bears fruit from a landscape that man has never tilled.

He feeds the beasts of the field from the palm of His hand. He watches while they bear their young; then teaches them to stand. He gives the seas their boundaries and hides His creatures deep. He teaches eagles how to fly and nest upon the steep.

He makes the clouds His chariot and rides on wings of wind. He champions the victim and brings proud men to end. He is Immanuel, God with us--come to earth through Christ. He is the Kinsman-Redeemer, who paid the slave-man's price.

He is the King of kings, Lord of lords; and worthy is the Lamb!
He holds the keys to eternal life where the dead in Christ now stand.
He is enthroned between the cherubim; and great is His <u>reward</u>.
The devil--His defeated foe; the weapon--His swift sword.

The <u>story</u> has a moral, so I'll hasten, lest you tire. Whoever you perceived He is, you might aim a little higher!

Homework: Ask God to help you test your condition of faith to remove any obstacles of unbelief that stand in the way of more abundant, adventurous, and effective life. Then proceed to the test. Be honest this is between you and God, he already knows... Choose the answer that most closely matches your response.

That wasn't too terribly painful, was it? Were you as honest as you could possibly be? My guess is that very few

of us chose all a's or d's. Few of us always or never exercise faith. Occasionally, however, I wonder how I'm doing. Do you wonder the same about yourself? Though a test like this could never give us a perfectly accurate

estimation, it offers food for thought. Let's consider any indications the test might propose. Remember, our purpose is not to grade ourselves but to examine our faith. Our answers can tell us a lot about our profoundly influential perceptions of God and ourselves. We're not going to get scientific or terribly statistical with the results, but if you'd like a mere suggestion to what degree you may presently be exercising faith, consider the following.

- If you chose mostly a's and b's, you are probably exercising active and abundant faith.
- If you chose mostly *b* 's and *c* 's, you are probably exercising a moderate amount of faith. Perhaps you are young in the faith and on your way to developing lavish belief. Or you may have recently had a setback that caused you to be distrustful. Keep in mind that virtually anyone is capable of going from predominately *a* answers to *d* answers almost overnight due to a sudden change in circumstances and the ability to sense God's activity. Happily, the opposite is also true. We are never wise to judge others for a weakness of faith (see Rom. 14:1), because we have no idea what challenges we have ahead.
- If you chose mostly c's and d's, you may battle significant uncertainty and fear.

Wherever you found yourself in this exercise, what factors do you feel may have you there? Perhaps you recently witnessed a true miracle, so your faith is soaring, or you may recently have experienced something that left you with doubts and disappointment about God. Explain.
